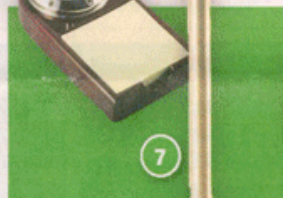
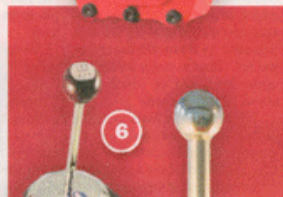

Marnie Kramer has been in the automotive



business for many years, working in car dealerships and even did a stint on the auto show circuit as a product specialist talking about cars.

Three years ago she decided to change directions, though she still is in the car field. She started a Web site, www.everythingcarz.com, selling automotive-related gifts. She calls it selling "a want versus a need."

She has close to 100 items, ranging from handbags made from inner tubes to that gift for the bathroom that has everything — a stick-shift toilet plunger.

Kramer, 38, who works out of her Wixom home, had some of the items manufactured for her, such as a piston door knocker, and ordered other items from manufacturers.
